## ABOUT ONEMARKETS FUND

**onemarkets Amundi Climate Focus Equity Fund** is a Sub-Fund of **onemarkets Fund** managed by UniCredit Invest Lux S.A. **onemarkets Fund** is the UniCredit UCITS<sup>2</sup>-Umbrella fund platform. The portfolio is managed by Amundi, which will act as the investment manager of the sub-fund.

### “ASSET CLASS” CHARACTERISTICS

- The Fund mainly invests in a broad range of equities and equity-linked instruments of companies from anywhere in the world which contribute to climate change mitigation by supporting the transition of the global economy through a trajectory of reduction of their carbon emissions.
- The Fund will at any time invest at least 51% of its net assets in equities and equity-linked instruments, of which up to 30% in companies that are headquartered or do substantial business in Emerging Markets<sup>3</sup>.
- The fund is actively managed and has no benchmark.

### INVESTMENT STRATEGY OBJECTIVE

- The Fund seeks to increase the value of the investor's investment over the recommended holding period: 4 years.
- The Fund aims to promote environmental characteristics aligning the carbon intensity of the portfolio with the MSCI World Climate Paris Aligned Index<sup>4</sup>. Additionally, this Sub-Fund promotes environmental and / or social characteristic through the incorporation of ESG considerations in the selection of investments (ESG analysis framework)<sup>5</sup>.
- The Sub-Fund qualifies as a financial product under Art. 8 (1) of SFDR<sup>6</sup>.

## INTERVIEW WITH THE PORTFOLIO MANAGER

### 1. WHAT MAKES THIS FUND UNIQUE?

- Unique concept focused on CO<sub>2</sub> reduction in Developed Markets equities to facilitate the transition to a Net-Zero<sup>7</sup> world.
- An active, fundamental, bottom-up approach<sup>8</sup> to stock selection within a disciplined framework.
- The Fund mainly invests in a broad range of equities and equity-linked instruments of companies from anywhere in the world which contribute to climate change mitigation by supporting the transition of the global economy through a trajectory of reduction of their carbon emissions.

### 2. HOW IS THE PORTFOLIO BUILT?

- We believe Net Zero targets should be achieved with a fundamental, bottom-up framework to increase likelihood of success.
- A careful fundamental analysis is essential to assess the financial and carbon reduction objectives of each company.

### 3. HOW DOES THE SELECTION PROCESS WORK?

- As we assess both “how” the company operates and “what” the company produces, we diversify across three different types of companies. The Climate Champions – the companies that are already very advanced in their CO<sub>2</sub> mitigation, The Climate Committed – the companies taking the right steps to achieve their goals, and finally The Climate Enablers – the companies that are producing the innovative technologies or products or services that facilitate the path towards a low carbon world.
- The blend of these three different business models results in a well-diversified, balanced portfolio, with no strong style biases.

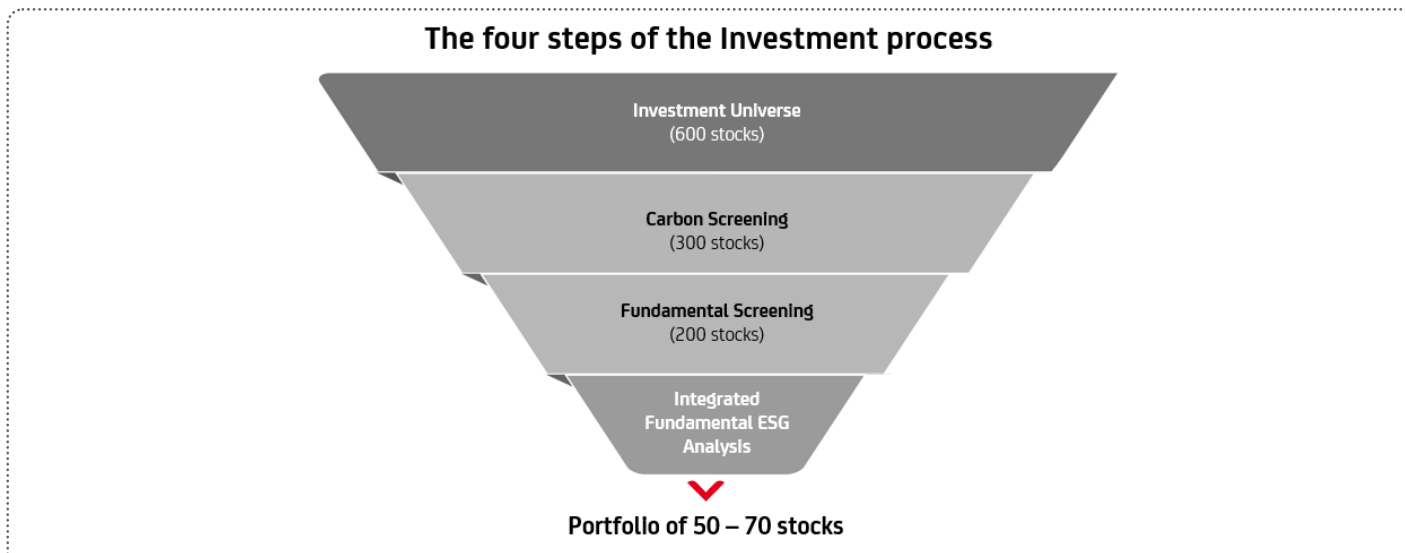
### 4. HOW IS THE INVESTMENT PROCESS?

- A concentrated, active portfolio based on robust fundamental analysis that aims to realise the net zero target path of the MSCI World Climate Paris Aligned Benchmark (PAB).
- The Funds invests exclusively in companies with realistic CO<sub>2</sub> targets that are achievable with today’s technology. The portfolio manager favours companies that have included CO<sub>2</sub> reduction targets in their management remuneration plan.

<sup>7</sup>The term ‘Net Zero’ refers to the balance between the amount of greenhouse gases released into the atmosphere and the amount of greenhouse gases removed. The United Nations defines ‘Net Zero’ as ‘reducing greenhouse gas emissions as close to zero as possible, with the remaining emissions being removed from the atmosphere, oceans and forests’. In addition to reducing emissions of carbon dioxide (one of the greenhouse gases), Net Zero can also be achieved by offsetting carbon emissions.

<sup>8</sup>Bottom-up investing is an investment approach that focuses on analysing individual stocks and de-emphasises the significance of macroeconomic and market cycles. Bottom-up investors focus on a specific company and its fundamentals, whereas top-down investors focus on the industry and economy.

## PROFILE OF POTENTIAL INVESTORS

- An investment in this Fund is thought for investors who are able to appraise the risks and economic value of the investment.
